FUNDAMENTAL REGULATIONS (*reproduced in part*)

(b) These regulations do not replace, but rather supplement, the requirements of governmental authority, the Racing Rules of Sailing and the rules of Class Associations.

SPECIFIC REGULATIONS

R6 Rudders and Tillers

R6.1 Unless the rudder box or rudder stock is securely fixed to the hull and requires tools to remove it, a rudder pin or pintle of each rudder shall be fitted with a stainless steel retaining pin that passes through the pin or pintle such as to prevent the rudder/s becoming detached.

R9 Hull Identification

R9.1 All boats shall bear the identification, required by R9.3, located externally on the transom, both outboard sides of the hull(s) or rear beam, or on the aft deck of sailboards.

R9.2 Letters and figures shall be legible, indelible and of contrasting colour to the background on which they are located and of at least the height and thickness specified.

R9.3 Required information:

- a) Name of boat in letters and figures at least 50 mm high and 8mm thickness
- b) Registered sail number in letters and figures at least 50mm high and 8mm thickness.
- c) Name of club (see 9.4) with which the boat is registered in letters and figures at least 20 mm high and 4 mm thickness.

R9.4 The name of the club may be abbreviated **except for boats registered in Victoria** where the name of the club must be in full except that the words 'Sailing Club', may be abbreviated to 'SC'.

R9.5 For the purposes of compliance at interstate regattas, a boat complying with the requirements applicable to its State of registration shall be deemed to comply with the requirements applicable in the State in which it is competing
